The Blessing of Community Through HCRC

When I was diagnosed with stage 2a breast cancer in December 2021, I was in shock. At only age 40 I hadn't started regular mammograms yet, but I felt a lump.

connected with the Breast Cancer Support Group. That group truly became the most significant way that HCRC blessed me during my journey. Their experiences, wisdom, and camaraderie were truly a life-line during this time. A few of us continue to keep in touch to this day to pray, encourage, and celebrate one another in this survivorship phase of the cancer journey.

My cancer journey involved targeted chemo, lumpectomy surgery, traditional chemo, radiation, and now anti-estrogen therapy. I have had three imaging sessions since completing treatment with no evidence of disease!

HCRC also pointed me in the direction of other partnering organizations where I received valuable counseling through Cancer Support Community; a victory trip through 17 Strong;

My supervisor, a breast cancer survivor, and one of my friends who had recently gone through a breast cancer diagnosis, both helped me navigate those first decisions of surgeons and oncologists and she also personally connected me with HCRC. I had no idea how consequential this connection would be at the beginning of my cancer journey. HCRC's social worker helped me navigate anxiety, sleep issues, medical decisions, and how to tell my daughters (then ages 9 and 13) about my diagnosis. She also encouraged me to get


