I was diagnosed with Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia/ Small Lymphocytic Lymphoma (CLL) in April 2022.

Like many others, my CLL diagnosis was incidental. Routine blood tests raised red flags which led to further testing and then diagnosis.

Any cancer diagnosis is a shock. The flurry of tests and appointments is disorienting. My husband and I began looking for as much information as we could. While we all need to be wary of "Dr. Google" we did find some organizations with terrific resources online.

What I did not expect I would do is join a support group. I didn't think a support group would be a good fit for me, and it wasn't something I'd considered. Fortunately, I decided to give it a try and attend a meeting of the "All Blood Cancer Support Group" facilitated by the Hearst Cancer Resource Center.

From the very first meeting, I realized the tremendous value of the group. The main benefit for me was what I learned—about my specific form of cancer, different treatments, local doctors and resources, as well as cancer specialists out of the area. It was a wealth of information, which made me feel more empowered, more in control.

As I continued to attend the meetings, I developed a fuller understanding of the different blood cancers and the

people who live with them. It wasn't long after I started attending the meetings that a neighbor was diagnosed with cancer. As I joined with others to provide help and support for my neighbor, I realized that I felt more equipped and comfortable to offer that help because of what I learned and experienced through the support group. 

The Power of Intuitive Collage

Intuitive collage is a practice that allows your mind to journey through images. It is a personal act. It is done by quieting your mind so your intuitive nature can choose images and compose a collage.

After breast cancer treatment (mastectomy, chemo, and radiation) I felt lost. The void was big. Where did everybody go? I walked around feeling numb. What happens now that life has changed so much?

To help answer the questions, I filled the gap with art through intuitive collage as I knew its healing power. I created an art journal of my journey and created the Hope Gives Us Wings installation in the Hearst Cancer Resource Center (HCRC). After the installation was complete I asked the center if I could teach an intuitive collage class to which the team agreed!

The collage process begins with the reading of a poem. Time is provided to reflect and journal how the poem connects to your current life circumstances. The next step is intuitive, no thinking! This consists of rapidly turning pages of magazines and collecting images, words, phrases, anything that catches your attention. From the images collected, a collage is created based on the poem and your reflection. All of this is done in silence as it is a personal experience.

The most amazing and wonderful part of the process is the group sharing of our collages. There is always laughter and a few tears, as insights, thoughts and unexpected messages come to light. The healing, the release of emotions and feelings that take place are gifts to everyone involved. The collages are taken home and posted for further reflection. It is fantastic how additional messages are revealed over time.
