DOBUTAMINE ECHOCARDIOGRAM EXAMINATION PREPARATION

A Dobutamine echocardiogram is an ultrasound examination of your heart that evaluates for potential heart blockages. Because you are unable to walk on a treadmill to increase your heart rate for this evaluation, you will be given in a graduated fashion a medication called Dobutamine intravenously that will increase your heart rate. Because of this you must follow the following guidelines prior to arriving to our office for this examination.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO PATIENT

- Do not eat or drink six hours prior to procedure.
- Do not take medications, including Nitro Patch, on the day of the test unless instructed to.
- Wearing a button up or loose fitting shirt is preferred for patient comfort. For female patients, you may need to remove your bra for proper lead placement during the procedure.
- Please hold the following medications 48 hours prior to the scheduled test: TENORMIN, ATENOLOL, LOPRESSOR, METOPROLOL, KERLONE, BETAPACE, SECTRAL, COREG, CARVEDILOL, INDERAL, PROPRANOLOL, TOPROL, BYSTOLIC AND BISOPROLOL. PLEASE HOLD ALL BETA BLOCKERS.
- Questions regarding medications, please call the office at 661-321-3161.
- Failure to hold these medications will result in rescheduling of your examination.
- Please wear no perfume, cologne or lotion.
- This examination requires an insertion of an IV. Should you have difficulty with this or special requests such as a porta Cath, please notify our office prior to the examination so arrangements can be made.
- This examination takes approximately 60 to 90 minutes to perform. You are allowed to drive home following the procedure. Should you have a history of low blood pressure or difficulty with medication it is suggested that you have a driver to take you home.
